Enviva plans to invest \$175 million in Alabama and will support nearly 300 direct and indirect jobs.




Enviva has created close to 2,000 direct and indirect jobs and delivered nearly \$1 billion in economic growth to the Southeast U.S.



Enviva buys low-grade thinned trees from the Geneva State Forest in southern Alabama, supporting a critical habitat restoration project that will restore over 800 acres of pine savanna habitat for gopher tortoises.



Enviva sources wood from more than 1,000 private landowners. We provide an additional market for their low-grade wood — increasing the profitability of timber harvest activities and creating an incentive to keep forests as forests.





ENVIVA POWERS ECONOMIC GROWTH AND INVESTMENT

Independent economic analysis indicates that for every one job created at an Enviva facility, more than two additional domestic jobs are created in the community.

Once operational, we expect the new facility in Epes will:

- Employ around 90 full-time employees.
- Create and support at least 180 additional jobs including logging, transportation, and local services.
- Represent over \$40 million per year in spending on wood fiber procurement.

Enviva plans to ship over 450 river barges of wood pellets annually on the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway. The barges will pass through lock and dam systems on the Tenn-Tom, contributing to the growth and sustainability of the waterway.

ENVIVA IS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE FOREST LANDSCAPE

Alabama is home to more than 23 million acres of forestland, and 88 percent of that is privately owned. Between 2000 and 2016, forest inventory in the Southeastern U.S. increased by 16 percent. Biomass plays a small but important role in Southeastern U.S. forest markets.
